

PROGRAM NOTES:

Prado - Victor Lopez

High adventure and resplendent percussion propel this energetic, tightly rhythmic original composition from prominent composer/arranger Victor Lopez. Lyrical melodic material interjects itself into the mix of timbral and harmonic interplay with fascinating results. A high-energy work that moves effortlessly between different moods and time signatures.

Lux Aurumque - Eric Whitacre

Lux Aurumque (Light and Gold) began its life as an a-capella choral work written in the fall of 2000. For this arrangement, commissioned by the Texas Music Educators Association, Whitacre rewrote the climax and included the grand 'Bliss' theme from his opera Paradise Lost. Lux Aurumque received its premiere at the 2005 TMEA Conference and is dedicated to Whitacre's dear friend Gary Green. The original work is inspired by a poem by Edward Esch (b. 1970)

Light, warm and heavy as pure gold and the angels sing softly to the new-born baby.

Carmina Burana - Carl Orff (arr. John Krance)

Carl Orff's first stage work, Carmina Burana, was composed in 1935-6 and premiered at the Frankfurt Opera in 1937; it became an outstanding success. Orff drew the inspiration for his grand vocal and orchestral work from a set of poems found in the 13th century monastery of Benediktbeuern, near Munich in Bavaria, and published in 1847 under the title of Carmina Burana. Both sacred and secular, the texts are frank avowals of earthly pleasure: love, eating, dancing, drinking and gambling. They proclaim the beauty of life and the glory of springtime. John Krance, who worked with Orff on this arrangement, has incorporated the vocal melodies into a setting entirely instrumental in structure. The arrangement includes 13 of the original 25 movements.

John Rolland holds a bachelor's degree in music education and a master's degree in wind conducting from SUNY Fredonia. He directs the Penfield High School Wind Ensemble and serves as chair of the Penfield music department. Rolland previously taught at Northport High School on Long Island where he directed the concert band, jazz ensemble, and chamber winds and was assistant director of the Northport Tiger Marching Band.

Rolland is director of the Junior Wind Symphony and Youth Wind Symphony at The Hochstein School and is a frequent guest conductor of junior and senior high honor bands throughout New York State. He has served as Interim Director of the Cassadaga Area Concert Band and Music Director of the East End Chamber Orchestra (Long Island, NY.)

As a percussionist, Rolland has performed with the Atlantic Wind Symphony and Western New York Chamber Orchestra and remains active as a rock, jazz, and pit orchestra drummer. He is head percussion instructor for the Gates Chili High School Marching Band, percussion section coach for the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra, and former front ensemble instructor for the White Sabers Drum and Bugle Corps.
