### Casey Springstead -

**Director, Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra** earned two degrees from the Eastman School of Music and he is a music educator with the West Irondequoit Schools since 1999. As a guest conductor, he has worked with area ensembles including Cordancia, the Nazareth College Concert Band, Irondequoit Concert Band, Brighton Symphony Orchestra, Rochester's New Horizons Band, and junior high and senior high All-County bands in Western New York. A faculty member at The Hochstein School since 2003 and the 2017 recipient of the Faculty Service Award, Mr. Springstead is the Director of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra. He has led the HYSO on tours of France, Austria, Spain, and Portugal, and in 2014, the orchestra participated in a live-via-satellite exchange concert with a youth orchestra from one of Rochester's sister cities in Lithuania. Previous appointments at Hochstein include Director of the Youth Wind Symphony and

For several years, he also conducted ensemble.twenty.21, a contemporary music ensemble comprised of faculty from Hochstein, Nazareth College, and Roberts Wesleyan College as well as musicians from the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Performances included a live broadcast on WXXI-FM's "Live from Hochstein" series. Mr. Springstead is a hornist with the Penfield Symphony Orchestra since 1999 and has performed with several area ensembles, including Mercury Opera, the Gregory Kunde Chorale, Ad Hoc, Cordancia, and as a member of many pit orchestras and ceremonial brass quintets. He is also active as a collaborative pianist, accompanying Rochester-area high school and college musicians for recitals and auditions. Originally from Hammondsport, NY, he lives in Webster with his wife and fellow musician/educator. Kirsta Rodean, and their two children. Orson and Malin.

### John Fetter - Director, Hochstein Philharmonia Orchestra

John Fetter is Music Director of the Hochstein Philharmonia Orchestra and the Hochstein Sinfonia Strings, and Director of the Hochstein summer camp String Jam: Alternative Styles for Strings. In addition to his work at Hochstein, he is a music teacher at Pinnacle School No. 35 in the Rochester City School District and an Instructor of Violin for the Eastman Community Music School. While teaching at the Eastman School of Music for more than a decade, Dr. Fetter was actively engaged with music teaching in the urban community. He coordinated the Urban Strings partnership between Eastman and the Rochester City School District, work for which he received the University of Rochester's Presidential Diversity Award and the Rochester Education Foundation's Making a Difference Award. Fetter earned his Doctor of Philosophy and Master of Music degrees in music education from the Eastman School of Music and his Bachelor of Music from the University of Northern Iowa. Beginning his education career as a Suzuki violin teacher, he was a faculty member of the University of Northern Iowa Suzuki School. He then was public school orchestra director in Greeley, Colorado, and performed in orchestras in Colorado and Wyoming. As a conductor, Fetter has worked with the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra, Richmond Symphony Orchestra, and New Hampshire Music Festival Orchestra. He also has appeared with the latter as a violinist, and coordinates the festival's Words on Music series. While occasionally found sitting in with blues and folk musicians, he also enjoys performing in chamber music settings and has performed on the Hochstein Faculty Artist Series, "Spotlight on Faculty."

### Matt Osika - Assistant Director, Hochstein Philharmonia Orchestra

Matt Osika is a Rochester-based trumpeter, teacher, conductor and composer. Currently teaching instrumental music at Thomas High School and Willink Middle School in Webster, NY, Osika performs regularly with the Penfield Symphony and Cordancia Chamber Orchestras. In the Spring of 2014, Osika founded the Young Composers Collaboration Project with the Hochstein Youth Orchestra Program, where students create, refine, and premiere large orchestral works. In 2012, Ludwig Masters Publications released Osika's chamber-ensemble orchestration of Percy Grainger's Lincolnshire Posy, which has been performed by the Eastman Wind Ensemble, members of the U.S. Navy Band, and the Ad Hoc Chamber Ensemble. Osika attended the Eastman School of Music as a recipient of the prestigious Lois S. Rogers scholarship where he received the Bachelor Degree in Applied Music/Music Education (2008) and the Master Degree in Music Education (2010). During that time, he performed alongside the Canadian Brass, served as tour manager for the Eastman Wind Ensemble, and served as Assistant Conductor of the Eastman Wind Orchestra. Trumpet instructors include James Thompson and Douglas Prosser; Conducting instructors include Mark Davis Scatterday and Brad Lubman.

Amy Feng, a senior at Pittsford Sutherland High School, is in her 7th season playing with HYSO. As a cellist studying with Kathy Kemp since age 7, Amy has been the principal cellist of HYSO (since 2019) and NYSSMA Junior High Area All-State Orchestra. Amy performed with HYSO as a cello soloist in the 2020 Hochstein Centennial Orchestra concert as a winner of the HYSO concerto competition. Also a pianist studying with Elier Suarez since age 5, Amy was the Grand Prize winner of the 2021 Rochester Philharmonic League Young Artist Auditions as well as the winner of the Aldridge-Tinker Scholarship for Instrumentalists and the Mildred and Julius Ness Award for Piano. She has also earned top prizes in the Duquesne National Young Artist Competition, Nazareth College Piano Competition, Empire State Piano Competition, David Hochstein Recital Competition, and

Genesee Symphony Orchestra Concerto Competition. She was invited twice to perform at the NYSSMA Conference All-State Piano Showcase concert and was invited to give a recital at the 2020 Rochester Piano Teachers Guild annual conference. Amy also plays cello in the Hochstein Saturday Scholarship String Quartet, which won the 2021 Youth Chamber Music Competition hosted by the Syracuse Friends of Chamber Music. Amy attended the orchestra conducting program under the guidance of Prof. Nancy Strelau in summer 2021. Outside of traditional concert halls, Amy is deeply involved in community engagement, organizing the student-run program Music for Love's outreach concerts and fundraisers since 2015. Aside from music, Amy loves math and science and plays tennis on the Sutherland varsity team.



# Meet the HYSO Staff

### Dr. Pia Liptak, HYSO Strings Coach

Violinist Pia Liptak performs as a soloist and chamber musician in Europe and the United States. She is on the faculty of The Hochstein School and is co-founder and artistic director for Cordancia Chamber Orchestra. Ensemble collaborations have included the Liptak-Beaudette Duo, Legno Duo, and extensive involvement with the new music scene in Rochester. In addition, she serves as the concertmaster for the University of Rochester Symphony Orchestra. Pia has performed and recorded three CDs with Japanese Koto-player Ryuko Mizutani in Duo vio-LINK-oto and a new CD, "Stars.Stories.Song," with contemporary music for voice and ensemble, has been released in October 2014 from Parma Records. Pia holds a DMA from the Fastman School.

### Jeremy Stoner, HYSO Brass Coach

Jeremy Stoner joined the faculty of the Hochstein School in September 2007. He teaches tuba, euphonium, trombone, and coaches student brass ensembles. Since 2005, he has also performed with the Plymouth Brass Quintet along with other Hochstein faculty members since 2005. An active freelance musician and teacher in his hometown of Rochester, NY, Jeremy holds a bachelor's degree in Music Performance from Oberlin Conservatory of Music and a master's degree in Music Performance from Northwestern University. In September 2011, he joined the faculty at Nazareth College as Lecturer in Tuba and Euphonium. Along with his teaching duties, Jeremy has also performed tuba concertos with the Symphony Orchestra and the Wind Symphony at Nazareth, is a member of the Penfield Symphony, and also plays bass, tuba, and sings with the band Teagan and the Tweeds.

### Diane Smith, HYSO Woodwind Coach

Diane Smith is a member of the flute section of the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra and a founding member of the Antara Winds. She has also performed with Rochester Oratorio Society, Rochester Broadway Theatre League, Mercury Opera, Lyric Opera, Skaneateles Festival, the Syracuse Symphony, and the Erie Philharmonic. Ms. Smith teaches flute and chamber music at The Hochstein School and Roberts Wesleyan College. ### GRETCHEN SNEDEKER MEMORIAL ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP FOR PRINCIPAL HORN

Gretchen Snedeker, a 24 year-old graduate student at the Eastman School of Music, was tragically killed in a car accident in April, 2008. She was principal horn of the Hochstein Youth Symphony Orchestra from 1998 to 2001, and featured on our first tour to Austria in 2001. She discovered her passion for music during her time with HYSO. ### DON MESSINA STRING INSTRUMENT ENDOWED SCHOLARSHIP

Don Messina studied piano and double bass, which he played in the East High School Orchestra and the Eastman School's Conducting Orchestra in the 1950s. He has been a life-long concert-goer and is currently pursuing conducting opportunities. This scholarship is in memory of Don's immigrant parents, Harry and Louise Messina, who loved music and who sacrificed much to encourage his musical aspirations. The Don Messina String Instrument Scholarship covers the HYSO tuition for one year and is awarded annually to a student currently enrolled in elementary, middle or high school, and plays a stringed instrument. ### ROLF HALLINAN MEMORIAL VIOLIN SCHOLARSHIP
