## HOCHSTEIN ANNOUNCES VOICE FACULTY RECITAL "THE BEST THINGS IN LIFE: HOCHSTEIN'S BEGINNINGS IN SONG"

Music and Stories Spanning David Hochstein's Life

At **2pm on Sunday, October 4** in the Hochstein Performance Hall, Hochstein School of Music Voice Department Faculty will be joined by Michael Lasser, host of WXXI's "Fascinatin' Rhythm" for a concert featuring songs from the lifetime of David Hochstein through the time of the Hochstein School's founding. **The performance is free of charge**.

The program begins with songs of World War I including "K-K-K-Katy" and moves forward in time to music of the Twenties and Flapper songs like "I Want To Be Bad." The performers will showcase torch songs such as "Can't Help Lovin' That Man o' Mine" as well as offerings by several famous songwriting teams, including Ager and Yellen and Donaldson and Kahn. The program ends, around the era when the Hochstein School opened, with well-known songs of songwriter Irving Berlin. Special guest Michael Lasser will join the performance as narrator of the musical journey. Along with hosting the public radio program "Fascinatin' Rhythm," Lasser has published two books on American popular music of the early to mid-20th century; his third book on the subject is forthcoming.
