Lilac Quartet named "Best Ensemble" by Syracuse Friends of Chamber Music

ROCHESTER, N.Y.— Congratulations to the Lilac Quartet, part of Hochstein's Chamber Music Connection, on being named "Best Ensemble" after performing selections by Barber and Beethoven at the Syracuse Friends of Chamber Music competition on April 14. One of the judges wrote, "You all play so beautifully together. It was a pleasure to listen to you today." They have been invited back to perform on May 19, opening for the Miró Quartet.

Coached by Shannon Nance, the quartet features:

- **Jessica Zhuang**, violin (Webster; junior at the Charles Finney School in Penfield and an exchange student from China; studies with Bin Huang at Eastman School of Music);
- Yawen Ding, violin (Pittsford; junior at Pittsford Sutherland; studies with private teacher Ginny Wenzel);
- Erin Allen, viola (Pittsford; junior at Harley School; studies with Olita Povero at Hochstein);
- **Jackie Hager** (Brighton; junior at Brighton High School; studies with Kathleen Murphy Kemp at Hochstein).

Hochstein's Chamber Music Connection Program offers fun and challenging opportunities to learn the art of chamber music and connect with other musicians in a small group setting. Ensembles of three or more are formed throughout the year for players of compatible ages and abilities.
