- **Beginning Flamenco Guitar** for guitar students ages 15 to adult;
- Plus, the adult **Pilates Mat & Accessories** class moves to daytime.

Hochstein's ongoing offerings include:

- Suzuki Strings and Music FUNdamentals classes for young children;
- Orchestral ensemble performance opportunities for students in grades 1-12;
- Choral, wind instrument, and chamber music ensembles;
- Individual instrument and voice lessons as well as music theory classes;
- Jazz combos, rock bands, and short-term classes in quitar, ukulele, harmonica, and banjo;
- Sequential dance instruction in ballet, tap, African, flamenco, and modern dance;

Adult learners can choose from a variety of classes, including:

- Short group courses in guitar, ukulele, banjo, and harmonica, as well as short-term individual lessons;
- Ensemble performance opportunities with HochStrings Adult Chamber Orchestra, Adult Cello Ensemble; Finger Lakes Concert Band, Beginning or Advanced Guitar Ensemble, Clarinet Choir, Jazz Combos, and Rock Bands;
- Dance classes including Ballet, Tap, Modern, and Flamenco.
